1. Introduction

At our school, we believe that a clear and consistent uniform policy promotes a sense of community, supports positive behaviour, and ensures all pupils are dressed safely and appropriately for learning. All pupils are expected to follow the uniform requirements outlined below.

We are committed to inclusion and will always work with families to support individual needs.

2. School Uniform Expectations

2.1 Tops

- **School logo polo shirt** should be worn at all times:

*(Please see **section 6**, for SEND adjustments)*

- **Grey polo shirt** on regular school days
- **Navy blue polo shirt** on **PE days**



- **School logo jumper or cardigan** should be worn with the uniform.

2.2 Bottoms

- Pupils may wear **black or grey trousers, joggers, or skirts**.
- Clothing should be comfortable, practical, and suitable for their day at school.

2.3 Summer Uniform (Optional)

- During the summer months, pupils may wear **green checked dresses**.



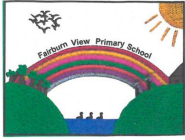
3. Footwear

3.1 Outdoor Footwear

- Pupils must wear **safe and sensible footwear** appropriate for the weather.
- Shoes should be suitable for playtime, movement around school, and varying weather conditions.
- Open-toe sandals, high heels, platform shoes, or footwear that poses a safety risk are not permitted.

3.2 Indoor Footwear (Winter Months)

- During winter, pupils are required to bring **indoor footwear** (e.g., clean pumps, soft shoes such as slippers, croc type shoes, clean trainers) to change into once inside the building.



- This helps maintain safety, cleanliness, and comfort during wet or snowy weather, particularly with the flooring we have in school.
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4. Physical Education (PE) Kit

- Pupils should wear their **navy blue school logo polo shirt** on PE days.
 - Additional PE clothing should be suitable for physical activity, such as joggers, shorts, or leggings, along with appropriate trainers.
 - **Jewellery must not be worn during PE lessons.**
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5. Jewellery and Accessories

- Pupils may wear **small stud earrings** only. Please make sure children aren't wearing hooped or dangling earrings due to health and safety risks.
 - Earrings must be removed for PE. If they cannot be removed by the pupil, they must be taken out at home before school.
 - No other jewellery (other than a watch) is permitted for safety reasons.
 - Hair accessories (such as bobbles, bows and headbands) should be simple, not too large and be plain in colour (e.g. green, white, black, navy). Save exciting hair accessories for party days and celebrations as the children can often get distracted by these.
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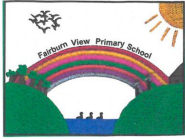
6. Support, Inclusion and Adjustments

6.1 Reasonable Adjustments for SEND

- The school is committed to supporting pupils with **Special Educational Needs and Disabilities (SEND)**.
- **Reasonable adjustments** to the uniform policy will be made where necessary to ensure comfort, dignity, and accessibility.
- We recognise that some children, including those with **sensory needs** or **Emotionally Based School Avoidance (EBSA)**, may require flexibility around certain clothing items to reduce anxiety and support regular school attendance.
- Adjustments will always be discussed sensitively with families and tailored to the child's individual needs.

6.2 Uniform Donations and Swap Shop

- Families are encouraged to donate **outgrown or no-longer-needed uniform** to school.
- These items are made available through our **school uniform swap shop**, reducing waste and supporting families.



6.3 Access to Free Uniform

- The school provides access to **free uniform items** for families who may need financial support, subject to availability.
 - Parents and carers can speak confidentially to the school office or pastoral team if support is required.
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7. General Appearance

- Clothing should be clean, appropriately fitted, and in good condition.
 - Pupils should come to school prepared for daily activities and weather conditions.
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8. Responsibilities

- **Parents/Carers:** Ensure pupils attend school wearing the correct uniform.
- **School Staff:** Monitor uniform standards sensitively, fairly, and with awareness of individual needs.
- **Pupils:** Wear the uniform with pride and follow expectations.
